

## Budget bill update

After accepting a 1,018-page amendment with many education changes, the House Finance Committee moments ago passed <u>House Bill 96</u> - the biennial budget bill. The full House will vote on the budget bill tomorrow, sending it to the Senate where hearings on the bill have already begun.

## Update on cash balance provision

The House increased - from 25% to 30% - the threshold that triggers a millage rate reduction for school districts with a cash balance exceeding that threshold. Other changes to this provision and the related policy include:

- clarifying that the reduction applies only one year at a time;
- requiring tax bills to include the following notice: "Notice: The school district taxes shown due on this bill are reduced only for the current year due to the school district's excess carry-over balance."
  - establishing a three-year forecast, rather than a five-year forecast;

• requiring, rather than using five-year forecast data, the county budget commission (CBC) to consider an earlier set of data, which must be submitted by July 15;

- requiring the CBC to consider rate reductions by August 15, rather than December 15 under the prior version of the bill;
- creating a special timeline for making FY 2025 reviews and tax year 2025 rate adjustments by requiring the CBC to convene and make its review and adjustments by October 31, 2025;
- clarifying that the CBC can reduce current expense levy rates below a total collections threshold of 20 mills; and
  - replacing the county prosecutor with the president of the county commissioners.
